


Greetings according to the time of day



“Good morning.”

Used from sunrise to
12:00 PM (noon)



“Good afternoon.”

Used from 12:00 PM to
around 5:00 or 6:00 PM



“Good evening.”

Used from around 5:00 or
6:00 PM until bedtime.

Greetings according to the time of day



“Good night.”

Used only to say goodbye
at night, or before sleep.

“Good night” is never used as
a greeting.

“Good night, see you tomorrow!”



“Good night, sir.”



Let's read the dialogue for morning time

Anna: "Good morning!"

Leo: "Good morning!"

Anna: "My name is Anna. What is your name?"

Leo: "My name is Leo. Nice to meet you, Anna."

Anna: "Nice to meet you too, Leo."

Leo: "How are you today?"

Anna: "I am fine, thank you. And you?"

Leo: "I am good, thank you."



Later in the afternoon ...

Lola: “Good afternoon, Max!”

Max: “Good afternoon, Lola! Are you hungry?”

Lola: “Yes, I am. Let’s eat lunch.”

Max: “Okay! Let’s go to the cafeteria.”



After university ...

Rajesh: “Good evening, Milo.”

Milo: “Good evening, Rejash. Are you going home?”

Rajesh: “Yes, I am. And you?”

Milo: “Yes, I am going home too.”

Rajesh: “See you tomorrow!”

Milo: “See you tomorrow. Bye!”
