Adjective

An adjective is a word that tells us more about a noun. It describes a person, place, or thing.

A dog. > A **big** dog.

A car. > A **red** car.

A teacher. > A **kind** teacher.

A house. > A **small** house.

“**Excited**”, “**angry**”, “**happy**”, “**tired**”, and “**sad**” are all adjectives because they describe how we feel.

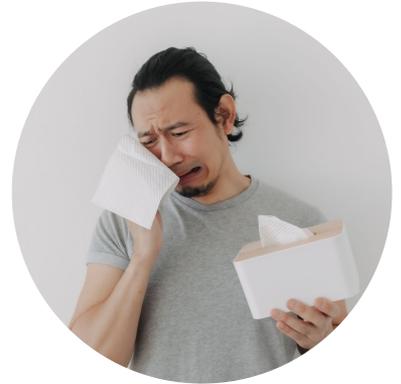

- Kenzo:** “Yes, I will. Thanks, Rita!”

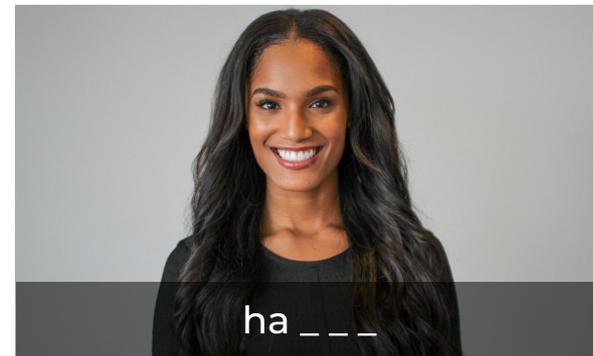
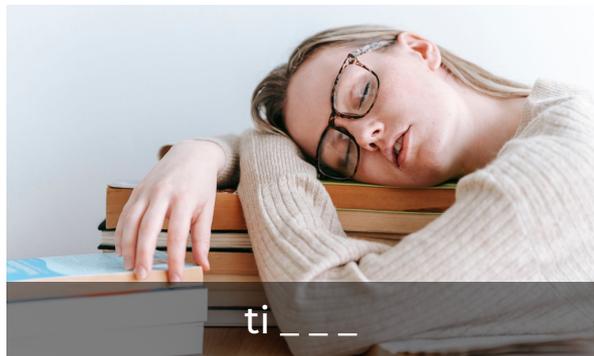
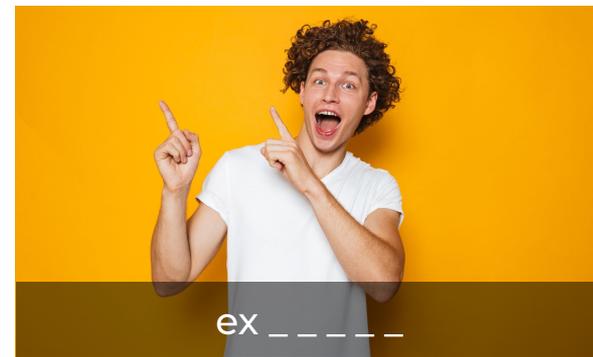
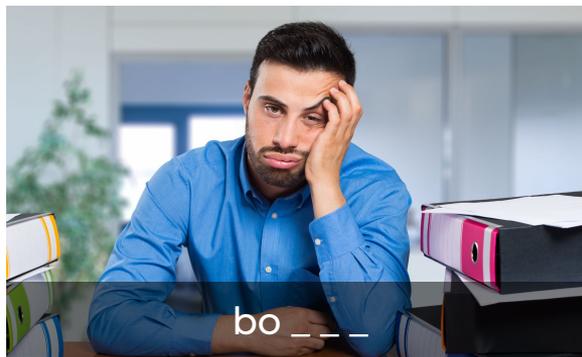
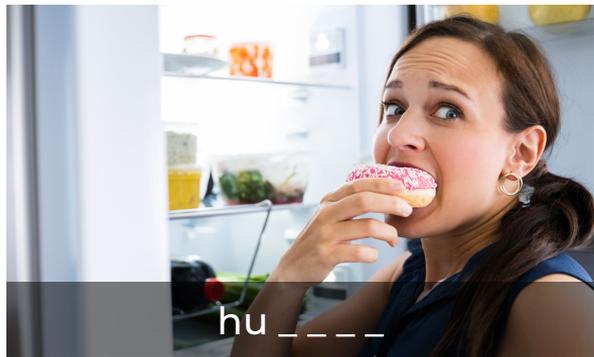
