

“zee” or “zed”?



The terms “zee” and “zed” both refer to the letter “Z” in the English alphabet, but they are pronounced differently in various English-speaking regions. “Zee” is the more common pronunciation in American English, while “zed” is the standard in British English and other Commonwealth countries.
